Over this project students will use the subject Theme of 'Cells' to produce a body of work. Students through the project are encouraged to use both primary and secondary sources as well as imagination to develop their imagery. They will explore and develop their drawing and painting skills using a combination of both traditional and more experimental media. Over the project the work of other artist's will be used to inspire and develop the student's insight into ways in which they can develop their own imagery.	Over this project students will design and make a 'shoe Sculpture' Students over the project will learn about historical and contemporary shoe designs and designers. Students through the project will be encouraged to use their knowledge of existing shoe designs to support them in creating their own imaginative designs.
